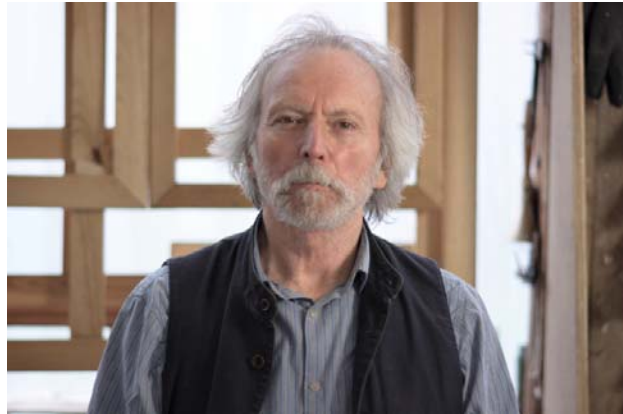


Louis Turpin, Life And Times

I spent the first years of my life on the 6th floor of a block of flats guarded on the ground floor by a cadaverous concierge, Mrs Timms peering from her office in the foyer and forbidding us younger occupants access to the lift. The views, a vista of bombsites, from the top floor were dramatic and once a year the London to Brighton vintage car rally passed below our windows. In this situation the parks and squares of London were a source of wonder and liberation to me. I played in the bombsites and scrambling through the shells of buildings loved the wild flowers that struggled through the rubble and the sight of great mushrooms bursting into this far from barren land.



We explored and fought and ran wild and returned home dripping blood from wounds inflicted in these playgrounds.

Christmas '55 and we move into a grand Regency house with stable block and hayloft and lions heads on the doorframes and a garden full of magic. There was a pear tree big enough to eventually accommodate a two-story tree house and a red brick path buried under grass and awaiting discovery. Sycamore saplings sprouted everywhere and I collected a farthing a go for their removal. My interests were fired and the following spring I discovered the beauty of forsythia and magnolia marking, as they did the advent of spring. Both grew in the small Victorian garden outside Brixton Library donated by Henry Tate to a society thirsting knowledge. The strength of the yellow forsythia (and the wonderful name) and the sheer size and blush of the magnolia on its otherwise naked branches took my breath away.

In 1965 I came back from a three month trip to America and started architecture studies in London. In a Damascene moment I was overwhelmed by both the sheer tonality surrounding me in Oxford Circus, the buildings radiating colours and a revelation that while I loved all the two-dimensional aspects of my work I could not see an abiding interest in extending this into three dimensions. After 4 terms I changed direction and worked on a coal wharf in Shoreham Harbour loading coal into sacks and onto lorries, amusing until work fell off in spring when I changed again and made hand built articulated and painted wooden toy soldiers.

Then to art school, Guildford for foundation and student dissent and Falmouth for fine art painting and latterly film making. On my return to London I worked as an Architectural model-maker and in the film industry before moving to the Kent Sussex border to make a World Health Organisation animated film on contraception, with my father Digby.

In 1975 I started to concentrate on painting and in an intense three month period I moved from abstraction to figuration, My studio was the large bedroom upstairs in my cottage and the view from this window was a hop garden. This hop garden was the pathway through to figurative painting for me, at first informing the abstract paintings and then by degree letting in the view. At this time my wife to be Davida moved in with me and became my muse in a series of paintings. Our life revolved around growing vegetables, feeding chickens socializing in local pubs and with artists, musicians and writers living around Rye and Hastings. I started a fruitful series of commissioned portraits and at the same time continued to produce my own work. In 1980 I was awarded the South East Arts Major Award and they purchased a painting of Davida in bed 'Patchwork' for their permanent collection, housed in the Towner Art Gallery Eastbourne. This award allowed me to complete a series of 'Provincial Interiors' which made up the nucleus of my first solo show 1981 in Oxford, timed to coincide with the inauguration of Green College, Oxford. By now Davida and I and our young son Aaron had moved from the country into Rye.

In 1983 I visited for the first time Vita Sackville-West's gardens at Sissinghurst. In those early days there was no one around except Pam and Sybille who had been head gardeners since Vita's time. This visit changed my painting direction. The series of walled gardens perceived as a series of 'rooms' were an unleashed version of the interiors I had been working on. Two years later in 1985 with a collection of paintings that reflected this new interest in horticulture alongside my enduring interest in the figure and landscapes, I made a trip around the UK. My VW van was loaded with a suite of paintings. I had appointments to meet the best provincial galleries and my starting point was Odette Gallery Cork Street London who asked me to exhibit with them.

Exciting times, this trip marked the start of a succession of solo shows, Rye Art Gallery in '85, Beaux Arts, Bath '86, Bohun Gallery, Henley-on-Thames '87, Grape Lane Gallery, York '88 and on. 1986 was a busy year, our

second son Theo now a practicing artist, was born. A painting of Davida was selected for the 'National Portrait Award' exhibition at the National Portrait Gallery and I was commissioned to paint Miss Pears. Paintings were also purchased by Bath University and for the John Radcliffe Hospital in memory of Emanuel Lee. The following year my painting of Miss Pears was unveiled on TV AM's Wide Awake Club, happy days, In '88 I was included in the publication 'The Painted Garden' by Anthony Huxley and in '90 the Chairman of the National Westminster Bank purchased a painting for their Head Office.

1993 arrives and with it the first time I was selected to exhibit at the Royal Academy Summer Show. Another first was my involvement with the National Garden Scheme. This resulted in a series of exhibitions over the coming years involving gardens in Yorkshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Cumbria and Berkshire. It also consolidated my understanding of how disparate the experience of British gardens, at their best, can be and also how fulfilling. By 1995 this exploration of National Garden Scheme participants resulted in a feature article in the Sunday Express Classic Magazine. In the previous year '94 I was again exhibiting at the Royal Academy and I had the first of many showings with the Royal Society of Portrait Painters. The following year '96.... but I really don't want this turn into some droning on list, so suffice to say I was busy. Glyndebourne got in touch, I painted their gardens and landscape. I was commissioned for a suite of paintings by a Cornish hotel, the Bedruthen Steps, 6 paintings each 6 feet wide, on the theme of the three seasons. Hastings Museum and Art Gallery gave me a retrospective exhibition which, from where I stand now seems a touch premature.

And the millennium was approaching. It is at this moment that I can briefly introduce my parallel universe in the shape of my first CD The Allotment Tapes, named after the painting reproduced within its sleeves and recorded at Chris Difford's Heliocentric Studio. For more info on this parallelity you need refer to another, musical section of this website.

And the millennium was upon us, Dame Stephanie Shirley commissioned me to paint two arch-topped paintings for the headmaster's study of the splendid school for autistic children, Priors Court and America called, I had my first solo show in Greenwich Connecticut. I was invited to Sissinghurst to paint the gardens and in 2003 I moved to new studios at Wittersham on the Isle of Oxney. In 2004 I had my second show in Greenwich Connecticut and produced my second CD, this time with Roger Hubbard. Its title 'House Up On The Hill' came from one of a series of paintings I had made of the beautiful Palladian 'Leasam House' that sits astride the landscape overlooking Rye and graces the cover of CD number 2. The following year I was invited to put on a solo show at Rona Gallery in London's Mayfair. Also in 2005 I explored the remarkable relationship between Gertrude Jekyll and Edward Lutyens in my Bohun Gallery exhibition. This triggered a request for me to exhibit at Hestercombe, one of the Jekyll Lutyens gardens I had painted for my Bohun show. The paintings were displayed in the splendid Orangery designed by Lutyens.

In 2007 Fred Olson of Olson Cruise Lines made contact and bought a suite of six large paintings for his Cruise Liner Boudica, I had my biennial Bohun Show and the final exhibition with Rona Gallery before they moved into new premise in Bloomsbury at the Langham Gallery on Lambs' Conduit Street. Somewhere in all this I started producing Indian ink drawings drawn almost exclusively with brushes and featuring the landscapes around Rye. The three valleys Rother, Tillingham and Brede offered fertile subjects for these, as did the sheep patrolling these landscapes. Fosse Gallery, Stow-on-the-Wold began exhibiting these before moving on to the paintings and eventually my solo show, Landscape Journeys with them in 2015,

The move to Bloomsbury opened another subject for my paintings. The gallery is close by the Inns of Courts and moving through these I began to explore the glorious squares and their flanking architecture. The architecture as a backdrop to the mature gardens changed again the way I was thinking about my paintings. Starting with the Inns I moved out from Bloomsbury eventually visiting some of the gardens from my childhood including Cleveland Square where I played while my parents discussed the beginnings of the I.C.A.

And here I am standing amidst Hastings allotments, some 60 years on and the same emotions hit me. There is the sea as backdrop, here all around are the individual plots expressing fiercely each toiler's individual take on life. 500 plastic bottles adorning 500 canes to protect the gardener's eyesight. I see clearly the continuity of human endeavour marching in parallel with the indefatigable spirit of nature. An uneasy alliance in which nature always has the final laugh, ah but the journey...
